Other Ways We Support DC

In 2004 and 2005, gave \$114,000 to 1,074 DC employees affected by hurricanes in Florida.
In 2005, DC employees raised \$81,695 for Corrections employees in Louisiana and Mississippi to assist after Hurricane Katrina's catastrophic damage.

Through the *Flags for Freedom Project*, the Foundation has recognized over 500 DC employees who have served in our armed forces since September 2001 by sending international calling cards and VISA gift cards during the holidays and certificates of appreciation to employees deployed from September 2001— May 2003. Plans to recognize all employees who have served since 2003 are underway.

Proven Record of Assisting Florida Department of Corrections Employees in Times of Crisis

Since July 1999, the Corrections Foundation through the Employee Assistance Program has distributed \$1.737 million dollars to over 1,390 Department of Corrections employees.

Corrections Employees to Get Specialty Tag Dedicated to Them



Louie L. Wainwright, President of the Corrections Foundation, was successful this legislative session in persuading the Florida House and Senate to approve a specialty tag for Corrections employees.

"For 60 years, I've worked with the finest Corrections employees there are. I'm proud to take this extra step to help take care of the men and women who protect and watch over Florida," Wainwright said. "Police, firefighters, and other first responders have had specialty tags that benefit and recognize them. Now our officers and staff will get the recognition they, too, deserve."

At an estimated cost of \$25 per specialty plate, the purchase of 15,000 tags would generate \$375,000 annually to benefit DC employees through the Employee Assistance Program. The annual use fee would also support other Foundation initiatives including a scholarship for children or dependents of employees injured or killed in the line of duty and a disaster preparedness and relief fund.

The Foundation specialty tag should be available at your local tax collector's office in December 2007 or January 2008.
